

# Central Health spends \$238 million in direct care annually which includes:

Community Services \$ 79,794,484

Patient & Resident Care \$ 77,038,136

Diagnostic & Therapeutic \$ 41,168,715

Medical Services \$ 20,840,404

Ambulatory Care \$ 19,066,796

### Other expenses include:

Support \$ 64,598,185

Administration \$ 32,012,130


